Dear Faith Family,

"I'm Trying." The tag line to last week's message about how Jesus loves you and "I'm trying." After the service on Sunday one of the retired teachers in our faith community approached me to talk about the word "trying." She shared with me that she had been at a conference once when they talked about the word "trying" and how the word usually meant to students that failure was expected.

While to some, the sermon title was catchy, and I pray everyone was able to follow along, I believe

this teacher may have a point. If we are just trying to do something--perhaps with a sense that it's going to fail regardless--maybe we need to change our attitude and make it positive. Something more along the lines of, "Jesus loves you and I'm going to love you as well." Not as catchy, yet actually it makes it more definitive, more promising.

Truth is, I believe we all like to try--or to say we are trying. Yet our faith may wane when it comes to feeling we may or may not be able to accomplish something not so easy like loving those whom Jesus loved when we find others difficult. "I'm trying" indicates there may be a good chance this won't work, "but we'll give it a try."

"How many of us love everyone we meet?" This question still looms a bit large in this season for me.

So, how can we love others? All others? Sometimes society gives us an out. Not everyone is treated equal and societal norms say, "That's ok, you don't have to love them. Maybe try, but don't worry about it." How can we love those we deem hard to love? Better yet, do we act in a way others can always easily love us?

I so appreciated the commentary after the sermon last Sunday for many reasons--mainly because it made me think and wonder--did anyone else hear the "try" as an expected failure or half attempt to follow Jesus' teaching?

I wonder, in hindsight, if I should not have entitled the message, "Jesus Loves You, I Will Too." But if I did that, what would happen when we fail? Would we try again? Would we not feel so bad about not being able to accomplish this simple but difficult goal in the first place that we just give up?

We, I believe, all need to work on our love for others. We acknowledge we will not be Jesus, but that does not exempt us from making that love, that dedication to love of others, our goal. Always striving to be like Jesus. For the gift of love truly is the greatest gift of all.

In John 13:34 we find Jesus' words: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." How should we respond to Jesus and this commandment and his life's lived examples? "I'm trying..." or "I will...?"

Knowing the difficulties of what lies ahead, there is something else I believe we need to know. Grace will cover us. If we hit bumps in road while attempting unconditional love of Jesus for all others, we too understand it's ok. We are covered in grace. And that grace is ours as well as all others. No matter what, though, I believe we are called out as followers of Christ, our brother, to the point that our goal needs to be Jesus loves you and I love you. I may not always get it right, forgive me, I do love you.

Here we are on the journey together to "Love More..." May your Lenten journey be good, and may your love of Jesus and all others grow stronger in this season.


