Dear Faith Family,

This past Sunday, we were filled with some unexpected "Holy Joy" moments - as one of my mentors used to call it. We cried a bit and we laughed a lot. And I must admit, it felt healing for me and I hope for us all to laugh - a bit unexpected - but then, isn't the Holy's work often unexpected? And I believe that is ok.

There's an old Gospel camp meeting song entitled "Life's Railway to Heaven," and in it, the words, "Life is like a mountain railroad, with an engineer that's brave, keep your hand upon the throttle and your eye upon the rail." My translation of the message is to keep moving forward following Christ's examples of living and the Holy will care for the rest.

As we cared for family and friends this past weekend and remembered the life of our beloved brother Russ, we were taking care, in the way I believe God called us to. And in the midst of it all, the Holy interjected and infused us with some much-needed comforting levity. A great reminder that there is more beyond death, death is not the final word, nor will it ever be. There is more to come, much more. Wednesday service this year will include both our Bell Choir and our Chancel Choir, and a brief Homily to introduce us to the season ahead. I hope you will be here as we mark the beginning of a great journey.

If you are unable to be here that evening, and yet would like to be marked by ashes on your forehead, please stop by the church earlier in the day and I will gladly accommodate you. Typically, the words that are said as ashes are imposed is, "From ashes we have come, and to ashes we will return." This year, I want to ask you a question to go along with that. "If from ashes we have come and to ashes we will return, what matters most in the midst of that coming and going?" Is it not love? This is the part that is up to us between the time of ashes, our earthly living, and how will we continue that living? Will it be from a place of love and service to others? And if so, are we prepared for the rewards and inbreaking of the Holy Spirit along the way?

The observance of this season is up to each of us. I know not what you – individually - need to do to draw you closer, but I do know this: A closer relationship provides for more Holy inbreaking and thus more Holy joy! Thanks be to God...Amen.

Grace Place @ The Farm

On Tuesday, January 16, Consistory discussed the possibility of moving Fresh Express out of The Church @ The Farm and over to the yellow building at 230 Brookpark Circle. After further discussions with Fresh Express leaders, it was determined this move would work best to serve our neighbors. The move would allow for more usable space in our Fellowship Hall for church events and activities as well as allow for more space, a larger sorting and packing area for Fresh Express, as well as additional distribution options.

When the move was announced in worship on January 29, the next day 15 volunteers showed up to help prep, prepare, clean and move Fresh Express supplies and our emergency pantry to its new location. Minor repairs and painting have continued and the pantry is set up and ready to go. Fresh Express saw its first distribution in the new location, that we are loving calling "Grace Place @ The Farm," on Thursday this week when more than 24 volunteers served more than 200 families. While there will be lessons to learn and most likely some tweaking to do, with the marked growth in neighbors being served by Fresh Express, this new space will keep the distribution close and allow for further growth should additional need arise. Additionally, beyond Fresh Express and the Emergency Pantry, Grace Place @ The Farm will allow space for a few household items from DIG Furniture Bank, a DIG referral space, an expanded Pet Pantry section in our emergency pantry, and meeting space for community groups. So many terrific options abound for this space as we live in to our dreams of how the Holy is calling us to be the church.

To volunteer or learn more, please see a member of our Consistory, a leader of our Fresh Express Team, or call the church office. And let us offer a huge thank you to



all our amazing volunteers who have made this happen along with all the volunteers who keep Fresh Express such a special piece of who we are. Stay tuned for info about a "Grace Place @ The Farm" open house following worship, soon!



Arts for Missions, February 18, 2 p.m.


