Dear Faith Family,

We are entering the last week of Christmas in July and the inundation of Christmas movies on the Hallmark Channel. Now, before you say anything, I do enjoy them. And this is about substance more than just romance. Recently, I saw one of the movies where one character was upset with another character because she had not decorated for Christmas. After some harsh words and expressions of anger and disappointment, the one upset discovered that the one who had not decorated had a very valid reason: she had lost her father recently and Christmas decorating had been their "thing." The character that complained so much felt horrible when someone stopped her and pointed it out. She apologized to the other character and said, "Sometimes, I just can't see past my own wants, needs and expectations. I had no idea about your father."

What a great message. Yes, the romantic interests still connected in the end, but the message was more about listening for the sake of hearing and understanding. The message was about grace, to know when to control your own tongue and that not everyone is in the same place as you, so, withholding judgement is typically the best policy. Above all, the lesson was "listen."

Recently, I have had several people come to see me. And what they needed was not my opinion--but to listen and listen carefully. It seems we have a human tendency to formulate opinions easily and not always listen fully for understanding.

In the text from I Kings 19, there is the story of Elijah running for his life and receiving a message to go up on the mountain and wait to hear the voice of God with instructions. We pick up the story at verse 11.

"Go out and stand at the mountain before the Lord. The Lord is passing by." A very strong wind tore through the mountains and broke apart the stones before the Lord. But the Lord wasn't in the wind. After the wind, there was an earthquake. But the Lord wasn't in the earthquake. After the earthquake, there was a fire. But the Lord wasn't in the fire. After the fire, there was a sound. Thin. Quiet. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his coat. He went out and stood at the cave's entrance. A voice came to him and said, "Why are you here, Elijah?"

Elijah had himself so wrapped up in what he was experiencing that he couldn't hear the voice of God, couldn't understand what God was calling him to do, how God would provide and offer protection if he would but listen. And God's voice came to him in a way he was not expecting.

Who would have thought there was a connection between a Hallmark Christmas movie and a Hebrew Testament lesson to listen? Get out of your own space, your own head, your own judgment and thoughts and listen.

I'm afraid we are all too busy in our own heads--with our own thoughts about what others should be doing, how others should be reacting--to listen closely to one another. Don't rush to judgment, don't think you know when you may not fully understand. God had a task for Elijah but until he listened fully, he couldn't even hear God's voice.

What about you? Do you listen fully for understanding before speaking, or do you shut down because you think you know what is being said already and you formulate your own opinion before taking time to fully understand another person's reasoning? Or understand the statement or question fully? And maybe this is why active stillness and listening are such important parts of our faith. Why don't you try it and see how your relationships improve? I believe we all have room to grow in this area and as followers of Christ, we can understand this practice may bring us closer to God. Put on your listening ears and let's learn and grow together.
