October, the Month of Awareness. In October we honor and remember both Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness and Breast Cancer Awareness. Both have impacted families among us here at Saint Paul's and thus impact us all.

We Pause, We Remember, We Reflect... October is Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month. Miscarriage, stillbirth, and other conditions can cause a pregnancy to end before or during birth. Infant death can be caused by preterm birth, birth defects, and other health conditions. October has been set aside to intentionally honor those who've experienced loss, to eliminate stigmatism and bring awareness of resources for families facing unthinkable challenges and struggling with unimaginable loss to find hope, answers, and a sense of community. While Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day is October 15, we seek to help families know they are never forgotten and are not alone.

We Encourage, Celebrate and Remember... October is also Breast Cancer Awareness Month, an annual international health campaign organized by major breast cancer charities to increase awareness of the disease and raise funds for research into its cause, prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and cure. In 2025, it's estimated that about 317,000 women and 2,800 men in the U.S. will be diagnosed with breast cancer, for a total of approximately 320,000 people. This makes breast cancer the most common cancer diagnosis in American women and the most common cancer diagnosis overall for men and women. This month is set aside to draw attention to testing, early diagnosis, research and support for victims and families who face this diagnosis. We seek to encourage and remind those diagnosed and their families they too are never alone.

Weekdays @ The Farm. Each Monday at 11:30 a.m. a group gathers for "Monday Morning Reflections," a relaxing time with Pastor Tim to dig deeper into the scripture from our Sunday service. On Wednesdays is "Pastor on the Porch" from 11:30 to 1. Pick up lunch at the Farmer's Market across the bridge from the farm or bring your own and join Pastor Tim. Then on Wednesday evenings, we offer "Wednesday Evening Interactive," a seasonal book/bible study from 6:30 to 8 p.m. On the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month is "Friends Who Breakfast." This has become a popular time to gather to catch up over conversation and breakfast at Street of Shops (9:45) on the 1st Wednesday and Silver Moon Restaurant (9:30) on the 3rd Wednesday (October 15). On the 4th Friday of each month, you can find a Saint Paul's group gathering at Union Cellars Winery for "Word, Wine, and Wisdom," from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. (October 24). Always a fun time as Pastor Tim tosses out a bible word to discuss with laughter and love.

Music @ The Farm. Our Chancel Choir, directed by Patty Wagner with Sharon Styer, pianist, rehearses each Sunday morning from 9 to 10. Our choir averages 25+ singers and there's always room for more! We also have a Hand Bell Choir which rehearses on Wednesday evenings from 5:15 to 6:15 and plays for worship on the 1st and 3rd Sundays. The Children's Choir practices during a portion of the Faith Connection classes with Miss Ashley and they bless our worship time once a month with their selections.





Serving @ The Farm. Mission and Outreach is an integral part of us "being the church" at Saint Paul's. On the 2nd & 4th Thursdays of each month, we offer a **Fresh Express Food Distribution** (October 23) in partnership with the Central PA Food Bank. Volunteers join us from 1 to 5 p.m. at Grace Place @ The Farm as we receive, sort, and distribute fresh food and groceries to our neighbors. All are welcome as we have a wonderful time serving together. (Featured pictures: Miss Emma and Miss Charley Jo helped with our Fresh Express Food Distribution on October 9. God's little hands are big helpers!) We also participate in

Community Harvest, a monthly distribution on the 3rd Saturday from 10 a.m. to noon (October 18) at St. John's UCC and in conjunction with Bucknell's Center for Community Engaged Leadership, Learning & Research. And, Saint Paul's has a long history of offering an "Emergency Food Pantry" that we lovingly refer to as our "Little Red Wagon" giving. The pantry is located in Grace Place @ the Farm and current needs that can be dropped in the wagon are: Canned fruits, vegetables, and soups, oatmeal, pasta, box potatoes, tuna and hamburger helper, shelf stable milk, peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti sauce, mac & cheese, tuna, salmon, canned meats, and grocery gift cards.
