Dear Family,

By now, most of you have likely heard of the passing of Russ, Russ Wynn, Jr., our beloved Minister of Music. That is the most clinical definition possible I believe, as Russ was not just a title or position. Russ was and will forever be considered a wonderful member of this family and faith community, and mostly as a beautiful child of God.

We were honored to share a piece of his life's journey with he and Mike. Russ came to Saint Paul's six years ago, seeking a more inclusive place to share in ministry for he and Mike and their God-given gifts and talents. Russ attempted to formally enter into ministry when he was young, just coming out of high school and college. He was told at that time there would not be a place for him in ministry as a result of his "lifestyle." Russ went on to pursue sharing his gifts and talents in other ways and became a teacher at all levels of education - from elementary to college.

Russ directed multiple musical groups and was involved in the local theater community and was proud of his students and all their accomplishments. One dedication to him that I read yesterday said, "Mr. Wynn and I didn't see eye to eye often (he was tough on his students and expected the best), however, I learned and now know, what he did for me. His mentoring and leadership made me who I am today and I am forever grateful." And there were others, many other memorials and dedications to Russ lauding his accomplishments and teaching. Russ had a beautiful gift and well, quite frankly, I believe we can thank the people that said there is no place for you in ministry because that just made him work harder and his living, being, and sharing God's gifts proved them wrong.

Russ quickly found his way into the ministry in the church too, this time instead of just preaching, he found his way into music ministry. Russ served most of his life as a minister of music, mostly in one church before coming to Saint Paul's. When Russ faced the adversity and challenges of being all God created him to be, first in the church, then in community, and again in the church, he, quite frankly never let that stop him. Thanks be to God! He continued on, being open to where God would lead, and God led him to a place where there was no judgment, only love and acceptance, which again allowed him to share his God given talents and gifts in amazing ways, preaching and teaching through music.

Russ's commitment and dedication to sharing the gifts God had given him and blessed all who were fortunate enough to know him were never to be denied. God had great plans for him and used him in amazing ways no matter what barriers others tried to enforce. The notes of sympathy and condolences, the notes of great gratitude and accolades over the past 24 hours alone are but a tiny proof of the amazing man God gifted the world with, in him. And I am grateful the Holy brought us together and him to this faith community.
