Dear Family,

I see you.

I see you reading this request to share your Christmas story and thinking, "Oh, someone else will do it. Someone with a better story. Someone who's a better writer. Someone whose Christmas memories are more interesting than mine."

And here's what they told us in seminary (yes, they actually teach this!): When pastors make a general "cattle call"—which feels like an appropriate phrase here on the farm—most people let themselves off the hook. "Surely someone else will respond," we think. And so... crickets.

But when pastors ask people individually? People say yes.

The problem? Asking 37 people individually is extremely time-consuming, and (spoiler alert) you all know none of us have that kind of time. So, most church leaders make the general ask and hope for the best, while most congregations comfortably settle into the habit of non-response.

But here's what I really want you to know: Your story matters.

I don't care if it's about the year the Christmas tree fell over, or the time your mom burned the turkey, or the quiet moment you realized what Christmas really means after experiencing loss. I don't care if it's funny or sad or simple or dramatic.

Someone in this congregation needs to hear YOUR story.

Someone will read about your Christmas morning tradition and think, "Oh, we could do that!" Or "our family used to do that." Someone will read about how Christmas has changed for you over the years and feel less alone in their own journey. Someone will see themselves in your memories and feel more connected to you and this church family.

Your story—the one you're discounting as "not that important"—might be exactly what someone else needs to read this Advent.

So here's my "cattle call" (again):

Would you write a 250-400 word reflection about either:

- Your favorite Christmas memory, OR
- What Christmas means to you today

You can include a Scripture or prayer if you'd like, or we can add one for you. We're creating an Advent and Christmas devotional booklet for our church family—something you can use at home, share with loved ones, or read together around the table.

Here are the details:

- Due date: November 9 (to Donna in the office)
- Publication date: November 30 (First Sunday of Advent—you'll get to take one home!)
- Goal: 37 devotions to take us through Advent and Christmas

# On the Journey Together

Sundays @ The Farm. At 9 a.m. our coffee is brewing, and the nursery and sensory rooms are staffed and open. Our <u>Faith Connections</u> classes run from 9 to 10 a.m. and include Pre-K to 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade "<u>Explorers</u>" with Miss Colleen, 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> Grade "<u>Pathfinders</u>" with Miss Krysta, and 9<sup>th</sup> Grade to Age 99 "<u>Travelers</u>" with Nicole and Dale Cuer. From 10 a.m. to 10:20, please enjoy breakfast, coffee, and fellowship then worship begins at 10:30. Following the "Time with Our Children," during worship, kiddos aged 3 to 2<sup>nd</sup> grade head back to the classroom for "<u>Children's Church</u>" with Miss Colleen and return to worship following Pastor Tim's sermon. On the first Sunday of each month, we celebrate <u>Holy Communion</u> together. And, monthly on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday, we enjoy <u>Family Night</u> together from 5 to 6:45. <u>Confirmation Class</u> with Pastor Tim and Miss Lisa meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday evenings at 5 p.m. And, on the <u>3rd Sunday of each month</u>, we gather around the tables in fellowship hall for a meal together following worship (October 19 is Octoberfest).



Weekdays @ The Farm. Each Monday at 11:30 a.m. a group gathers for "Monday Morning Reflections," a relaxing time with Pastor Tim to dig deeper into the scripture from our Sunday service. On Wednesdays is "Pastor on the Porch" from 11:30 to 1. Pick up lunch at the Farmer's Market across the bridge from the farm or bring your own and join Pastor Tim. Then on Wednesday evenings, we offer "Wednesday Evening Interactive," a seasonal book/bible study from 6:30 to 8 p.m. On the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month is "Friends Who Breakfast." This has become a popular time to gather to catch up over conversation and breakfast at Street of Shops (9:45) on the 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday and Silver Moon Restaurant (9:30) on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday. On the 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of each month, you can find a Saint Paul's group gathering at Union Cellars Winery for "Word, Wine, and Wisdom," from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. (October 24). Music @ The Farm. Our <u>Chancel Choir</u>, directed by Patty Wagner with Sharon Styer, pianist, rehearses each Sunday morning from 9 to 10. Our choir averages 25+ singers and there's always room for more! We also have a <u>Hand Bell Choir</u> which rehearses on Wednesday evenings from 5:15 to 6:15 and plays for worship on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays. The <u>Children's Choir</u> practices during a portion of the Faith Connection classes with Miss Ashley and they bless our worship time once a month with their selections.

Serving @ The Farm. Mission and Outreach is an integral part of us "being the church" at Saint Paul's. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Thursdays of each month, we offer a <u>Fresh Express Food Distribution</u> (October 23) in partnership with the Central PA Food Bank. Volunteers join us from 1 to 5 p.m. at Grace Place @ The Farm as we receive, sort, and distribute fresh food and groceries to our neighbors. All are welcome as we have a wonderful time serving together. We also participate in <u>Community Harvest</u>, a monthly distribution on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday from 10 a.m. to

noon at St. John's UCC and in conjunction with Bucknell's Center for Community Engaged Leadership, Learning & Research. And, Saint Paul's has a long history of offering an "Emergency Food Pantry" that we lovingly refer to as our "Little Red Wagon" giving. The pantry is located in Grace Place @ the Farm and current needs that can be dropped in the wagon are: Canned fruits, vegetables, and soups, oatmeal, pasta, box potatoes, tuna and hamburger helper, shelf stable milk, peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti sauce, mac & cheese, tuna, salmon, canned meats, and grocery gift cards.
