Dear Faith Family,

I am in awe of you. I am in awe of the ways in which you respond, the ways in which you keep connection, the ways in which you share burdens and express joys. As a faith family you reach out to one another without waiting for someone to reach out to you. You check on, care for and nurture others, you are willing to serve at the ask and are always on the lookout for ways we may be able to help one another and others. What I see in you all is a beautiful faith family, trying our best to be the church as Christ intended.

Earlier this week, I heard that a member of our family got up at 4:30 a.m. on New Year's Day to watch the New Year's Day parade live from London to see if they could catch a glimpse of Thomas Wagner marching in the parade! Think that meant something to Thomas or his family? I heard of another member showing up at Sadie's Nutcracker performance. Do you think that meant something to Sadie or her family? Hardly a day goes by that someone doesn't stop at the church to ask, "Is there anything I may do to help around here?" We have one person who will drive people where they need to go if he's available. "It's my own ministry," he will tell you. We have another person who, if we get a call for the emergency pantry or from someone who doesn't have food and can't get to the church, she will deliver - if at all possible - and if we don't have something that is needed in the pantry, it's not unusual for her to stop at a store, pick it up, and deliver it to the neighbor in need.

I could go on and on with story after story about how members of this family step-up and help out, in little ways that mean so very much! It reminds me of the saying (my version) "to the world, what you do may not be much, however, to the person, the neighbor, the stranger, the

family member, you help, it may mean the world." This is what being a faith community, being the church, looks like, at least to me. And I believe our children are watching and I see them wanting to help - and stepping-up to help if they're able. They see what is being done, because they are a part of the church and in seeing, they begin to ask questions and are invited to help when and where they can. This is church. The next time you hear someone say, "I don't know what this world is coming to..." I invite you to ask them to look around, because at least from where I am sitting and what I am seeing, it's becoming love, even when we don't see it in newscasts or hear it being promoted around us.

Some time ago, we talked about building a bigger hospital for those who are soul sick and hurting, a bigger cafeteria for those who are hungry, a bigger table for those who want to gather and just be and know someone else cares, a community of broader welcome and a sacred safe space. That is what I see so many of this family doing, just these things. I smiled the other day when I heard someone say, "I invite people to come sit by me all the time. I see someone sitting alone and I go talk to them and invite them to come sit with me." Of course, if they have a soft spot for animals, she's really interested in getting to know them and there's nothing wrong with finding that common ground, that's community work too.
