Dear Faith Family,

In my undergraduate Psychology class, our seats were arranged in a circle as the professor said we had much to learn from one another and it was easier to learn looking at faces than the back of heads. One evening, we came into class, got situated in our usual spots in the circle, and he fired off the first question of the evening without any fanfare or introduction.

"What religion are you?"

And tapped a classmate on the shoulder and said, "go." That classmate blurted out that he was Catholic. The professor pointed at the next person telling us to keep going, the next person said "Baptist." Then the next, "Methodist." The next agnostic. The next Episcopal, Baptist, non-denominational, evangelical, Church of Christ, it really started moving quickly around the circle until all of a sudden the professor shouted, "Stop!" Startled a bit, the room became immediately silent. That's when he explained the question.

He shared that we had done what most people will do--we explained our affiliation with a group of people. Instead, he said, "Your religion isn't your affiliation with an organization. Your religion is what you are in your heart 24x7x365."

I've never forgotten that class, that question, the explanation or the discussion we had that night about how what we believe in our hearts is how we act and that deephearted belief impacting our action, that is what defines our religion.

This week alone, I have heard three different stories of people struggling with "religion"--when in reality, they are struggling with the actions of others that couch their actions in their personal definition of religion. Instead of seeking to understand and act on their own beliefs, these people have become paralyzed by what others are doing and saying, allowing others to influence their own religion so much they are ready to leave their faith behind.

I would say and have said, "Why are you allowing others to have power over you?" Are you putting other's definition of God and Jesus above what you know in your heart? Are you allowing others who hide behind religion to define who Christ is for you, or are you living out who you believe Christ to be?

It is sad and even maddening when people couch their actions behind their "religion" to justify killing, war, segregation, ordination of power of one person over another, profit over care for people, marginalization over unity. And I often find myself asking the question rhetorically, "Who are you?" Maybe that is the better question than, "what religion are you?" I mean the answer is the same to either question. Our actions and reactions define who we are.

Do we allow actions of others to fracture and paralyze us and keep us from being who God calls us to be? Preventing our God given gifts to help others? I know more questions, but seriously, "Who are you?" What is your religion? Have you turned to an opinion and entertainment source to fill your mind and heart with religion, or have you rolled up your sleeves and lived out what you say you believe?

I believe the thing that makes me the saddest is both the people who walk away from their beliefs because they have allowed others to define "religion" for them and those that sit by and watch other's faith deteriorate and don't reach out to check in with those who may be hurting. "That's just the way it is," is not an option, at least it wasn't to Jesus, nor do I believe it should be to Jesus' followers. What religion are you?
