Dear Faith Family,

Below is an edited version of what I shared with Consistory this past week as we reviewed the state of the church through the first half of 2025. So, I wanted to share a bit of that communication with you all.

Let me begin by sharing a word of thanks for the ways I get to participate with you in being the church. Today, just as always you welcomed family home. A long-ago Saint Paul's family brought their mother and sister back to Saint Paul's, as was her wish, for her celebration of life. A dozen or more members came together to help welcome, feed, and offer comfort to her family by doing what we do, be the church. So, I begin this month's report as I have so many times before, saying thank you.

Since we last met, we have marched in the Union County Fourth of July Veterans Parade, where more than a dozen people helped us thank our veterans with this year's float built to pay tribute to Union County Veterans. The float was met with cheers and thanks for our presence as our messaging was about love and freedom for all.

This summer's attendance and giving has thus far mirrored last summer's trends in many ways, we are nothing if not consistent. Our actual attendance continues to show about a 10% increase, and we have welcomed just over 30 first time visitors since the beginning of June. Some have already returned, and others have reached out to tell us they will return, and still others have told us they are just checking out churches this summer seeking either a new faith community or a church home for the first time.



The Farm Report

Into the Deep! This year's United Church of Christ Tri-Annual Synod was held this past week in Kansas City, Missouri. Resolutions are received and voted upon by representatives across the nation from UCC congregations just like ours. In the United Church of Christ, while the churches operate as congregational bodies--meaning self-governing-the support for the churches come from a local Association, area Conferences, and the National setting of the United Church of Christ. Until Monday morning, at 9:50 a.m. Central Time, Pennsylvania operated with four distinct Conference offices, each with Conference Ministers and staff. After a two-year study, discussions and meetings, a motion went before the Synod to combine these conferences to form the Keystone Conference. Below is a message to the Conference concerning this event and vote.



Message to the Conference. Dear Keystone Friends... With full hearts and joy-filled spirits, we are thrilled to announce the historic passage of the motion to create the Keystone Conference of the United Church of Christ! By a vote of 98% (640 in favor, 8 opposed, 6 abstentions), delegates of the 35th General Synod approved the realignment of our Conference boundaries. This moment marks the culmination of several years of faithful discernment, courageous conversation, and a shared vision for the future of our ministry in Pennsylvania. Together, we have dared to believe that God is still speaking--and calling us into something new.

The creation of the Keystone Conference is more than a structural shift; it is a bold witness to our commitment to covenant, collaboration, and the continuing call of the Holy Spirit. We honor the legacy

of those who have gone before us in each of our four Conferences and rejoice in the new pathways and possibilities now open to us. We give thanks for the Keystone Working Group, Conference staffs, and all who labored, prayed, and dreamed this into being. And we move forward with gratitude, humility, and a renewed passion for the Gospel.

We trust that the One who began a good work among us will be faithful to complete it.

More Notes from This Year's 35th Annual Synod! Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson, General Minister & President of the United Church of Christ, delivered her State of the Church Address at General Synod drawing on the Luke 5:4 text: ⁴When he finished speaking to the crowds, he said to Simon, "Row out farther, into the deep water, and drop your nets for a catch." - Nursery and Sensory Rooms are staffed and open only during Church (Sundays, 10:15am-11:45am), Family Night (2nd Sunday, 5-7pm), and Sunday School (early Sep-mid-June, 9am-10am).
- Both of these rooms are set up to be used by age or needsappropriate families and children only during staffed hours, with age-appropriate supervision.
- These rooms are not to be used as open, general free play spaces during fellowship meals or other open church events (Sensory families may use the Sensory room during church events as needed, with age-appropriate supervision).
- If you use the space for a specific event, please be mindful of using each area for age and needs- appropriate children, and return them clean and organized.
- We ask that no one access teaching supplies unless given specific permission by a teacher or a staff member.
